RHODE ISLAND VS. CONNECTICUT - SERIES NOTES

- Saturday is the 94th meeting in the series, with UConn leading 51-34-8.
- The 93 games against UConn are the third most for Rhode Island with any opponent. The only teams the Rams have played more often than Connecticut are Brown (102) and Maine (96).
- Rhody has 34 wins against UConn, its second most against any school (Massachusetts - 37 wins).
- Saturday will be the first game between the teams since a 52-10 UConn victory on Sept. 26, 2009.
- The series began in 1897. At 121 years, it is the oldest rivalry among college teams in URI history.
- Rhode Island, Connecticut and Massachusetts formed the Athletic League of New England State Colleges in 1896. The first year featured games against high school and YMCA club teams.
- Both schools were original members of the Yankee Conference, which began play in 1947.
- The Yankee Conference eventually became what is now CAA Football.
- Rhode Island beat Connecticut 26-21 in 2000, Rhody's lone victory against an FBS level program. It was Connecticut's first season as a Division I-A program, the first of two seasons as an independent program before the Huskies became a full-fledged Division I-A program. It is the only win over a Division 1-A program in school history.

RAMS LEAD NATION IN FUMBLE RECOVERIES

- With five fumble recoveries through two games, Rhody is No. 1 in the country, tied with Weber State and Alabama State. Rhode Island and Richmond are tied at the top of CAA Football in turnover margin, both sitting at +1.5 per game.
- The Rams are No. 12 nationally in turnover margin (+3) and turnovers gained (5).
- In both of its games, Rhode Island has scored 14 points off turnovers.
- Over its last six games dating back to last season, the Rams are +2 in the turnover margin while posting a record of 4-2.
- In the first seven games of 2017, Rhody was -6 in turnover margin while going 1-6.
- Over its last 13 games, Rhode Island's defense has recovered 16 fumbles.

LAWSON NAMED CAA FOOTBALL OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

- For the second time in his career, Rhode Island quarterback **JaJuan Lawson** was named the CAA Football Offensive Player of the Week following his game against Albany, in which he completed 22-of-28 passes for 317 yards and four touchdowns.
- The touchdown passes went to four different receivers as **Marven Beauvais**, **Isaiah Coulter**, **Aaron Parker** and **Tyler Burke** each caught a scoring strike from Lawson.
- Lawson is just the second player in Rhode Island history to win CAA Football Offensive Player of the Week multiple times. **Steve Probst** won the award twice in 2010.
- Lawson also became the first Rhode Island quarterback to throw four touchdown passes in one game since Probst did so in 2011.
- It was the 12th time in program history a Rhode Island player has thrown four or more in a game. **Tom Ehrhardt** did so six times, and Lawson, Probst, **Derek Cassidy**, **Tom Ryan**, **Chris Hixon** and **Chris Paul-Etienne** each have one to their credit.
- Through the first two weeks of the season, Lawson leads the CAA in passing efficiency (184.5) and touchdown passes (5). He is second in completion percentage (71.4) and third in both passing yards (487) and passing yards per game (243.5).
- Lawson also improved his career passing percentage to 62.2 percent, the best in program history. No other Rhode Island player with at least 100 attempts is higher than 58.6 percent.
- This is the second straight week Rhode Island has received a league player of the week honor. Senior linebacker **Justin Hogan** was the Defensive Player of the Week following the Week 1 win at Delaware.

LAWSON BRINGS ACCURATE TOUCH

- Redshirt senior **JaJuan Lawson** completed 12-of-28 passes last week (78.6 percent), improving to 62.2 percent for his career.
- He is the most accurate passer in Rhody history among players with at least 100 attempts.
- Over his last three halves of play, Lawson is 30-of-38 for 453 yards, five touchdowns and no interceptions
- Lawson completed 59.7 percent of his passes in 2017, the fourth-highest single-season completion percentage in program history.
- With the win last week, Lawson is now 4-3 since taking over as the starting quarterback.
- The Rams were 3-19 in the previous 22 games before Lawson became the starter.

RAMS LEAD NATION IN FUMBLE RECOVERIES

- In the first seven games of 2017, Rhody was -6 in turnover margin while going 1-6.
- Over its last 13 games, Rhode Island's defense has recovered 16 fumbles.

RAMS CRACK TOP 25 IN STATS FCS POLL

- For the first time since 2005, Rhode Island has cracked a national Top 25 poll, landing at No. 25 in the latest STATS FCS Top 25 Poll.
- Following a 45-26 win over CAA Football opponent, the Rams more than doubled their vote total from Week 1, receiving 358 votes. The boost helped Rhody move from No. 29 up to No. 25, well ahead of Austin Peay (225 votes).
- Rhode Island last cracked the STATS Top 25 in 2001, when it ended the season ranked No. 21.
- In 2005, the Rams were ranked No. 25 in the Division I-AA Sports Network Top 25 poll after starting the season 3-0.
- Head Coach **Jim Fleming** has Rhode Island 2-0 in conference play for the first time since 2001, when the Rams opened the season with seven straight wins, including a 5-0 mark in the then Atlantic 10.
- Rhode Island nearly got into both national top 25 polls. In the AFCA FCS Coaches Top 25 Poll, it came in No. 27.
- Last week the Rams were No. 33 in that poll.

FIVE PLAYERS CHOSEN AS CAPTAIN

- Rhode Island will have five players serving as team captains in 2018.
- Redshirt senior quarterback **JaJuan Lawson**, senior linebackers **Justin Hogan** and **Nas Jones**, senior safety **D.J. Stewart** and redshirt junior center **Dwayne Scott** have been selected by their teammates to lead the Rams this season.

PARKER EXTENDS STREAK TO 20 GAMES

- Junior **Aaron Parker** had nine catches for 146 yards and one touchdown last week.
- He leads the Rams with 12 catches, and he has caught at least one pass in 20 straight.
- Parker led Rhody with 51 catches in 2017, earning All-CAA Football Second Team honors. He had 823 receiving yards, which ranked 41st in the nation and were the ninth most in a season in team history.
- Parker is 10th in program history with 1,455 career receiving yards. He needs 150 more to tie **Bob Donfield** (1983-87) for ninth place.
- With 12 touchdown catches, Parker is 10th in program history. He needs one more to tie Donfield in that category as well.
- From 2016-17, Parker had a streak of nine games with a touchdown catch, breaking **Bobby Apgar's** mark of seven straight games, set in 1994.
- With his touchdown catch against Albany last week, Parker now has 13 total touchdowns in 23 career games.

GINNETTI A FORCE IN THE MIDDLE

- Junior **Brandon Ginnetti** - a third-team All-CAA Football selection last season - has nine tackles, 1.5 tackles for loss, 1.0 sack and two fumble recoveries through two games.
- He and Maine's **Deshawn Stevens** lead the league with two fumble recoveries.
- Ginnetti returned his fumble recovery 30 yards against Albany, coming just 1 yard shy of his second career fumble return for a touchdown. In 2016, Ginnetti had a 65-yard fumble touchdown return against Towson.
- In 2017, he led the team and ranked fifth in the league with 7.0 sacks. He also had 37 tackles and 10.5 TFLs.
- Ginnetti broke up five passes and helped the defense set a program record with 32 sacks.
- He became just the sixth player in program history to record three sacks in the same game when he did so at Albany.
- Ginnetti and **Aaron Parker** were named to the 2018 CAA Football Preseason All-Conference Team.

LET'S GET IT STARTED

- Senior safety **D.J. Stewart** and redshirt junior center **Dwayne Scott** have the longest active streaks on the team. Both have started 24 consecutive games, going back through the 2016 campaign.
- Junior offensive lineman **Kyle Murphy** is next with 16 consecutive starts, most of which have come at left guard.
- Senior linebacker **Justin Hogan** and junior defensive tackle **Brandon Ginnetti** have started the last 13 games.

NEW FACES MAKING AN IMMEDIATE IMPACT

- Junior linebacker **Brnayan Javier-Castillo** leads Rhode Island with 15 tackles in the season opener. The Lackawanna transfer also has 1.5 tackles for loss.
- Graduate senior **Kadin Booker** - who transferred from Ball State - has started both games at right tackle and helped the Rams 111.0 rushing yards per game.
- Junior wideout **Ahmere Dorsey** - a transfer from Nassau Community College - had a 69-yard punt return for a touchdown last week against Albany, giving Rhody its second special teams touchdown in as many games.

VETERAN TRIO CLOSING IN ON 100 RECEPTIONS

- Rhode Island has three players approaching 100 career catches. Senior **Khayri Denny** is Rhode Island's active leader with 92 career receptions.
- Junior **Aaron Parker** has 86 career catches, while redshirt senior **Marven Beauvais** has 79 receptions.
- The only time in program history Rhode Island had three or more active players with 100 career catches was on the 1985 roster, when the Rams had **Brian Forster** (284 career catches), **Dameon Reilly** (165) and **Tony DiMaggio** (149) playing together.
- That 1985 team also featured **Bob Donfield** (1983-87) and **Jim Muse** (1984-87), who finished with 134 and 118 catches, respectively.
- The last Rhode Island player to record 100 career catches was **Robbie Jackson** who had 110 catches from 2012-14.

BURKE MAKES THE MOST OF HIS GRABS

- Senior tight end **Tyler Burke** has eight career catches in 13 games with the Rams.
- Four of his eight catches have resulted in touchdowns.
- Burke has scored in each of the first two games this season, tying him with **Aaron Parker** for the team lead with two touchdowns.
- Burke is averaging 27.3 yards per catch, sparked by his career-long 57-yard touchdown at Delaware.

CARRICK PERFECT ON THE SEASON

- Sophomore kicker **C.J. Carrick** had six extra points last week against Albany, just the ninth time in Rhode Island history a player has had six or more in one game.
- Carrick is 9-for-9 on extra points this year, the most extra points for anyone in the league.
- Carrick also has made his lone field goal attempt, a 28-yarder against Albany.

BRYANT IMPRESSIVE IN THE BACKFIELD

- Redshirt junior **Zoe Bryant** ranks seventh among CAA Football players with 74 rushing yards per game.
- Through two games, Bryant is averaging 4.4 yards per carry.
- Last week against Albany, he had the first rushing touchdown of his career.
- Bryant's consistent running has helped the Rams win the time of possession battle, as the Rams are averaging 32:09 minutes of possession per game.
- Bryant began his career as a linebacker, appearing in 12 games and starting five over the first two years he was at Rhode Island.
- He switched to offense due to injuries.

LIGHTS, TURF COMING TO MEADE STADIUM

- Two University of Rhode Island alumni have each committed \$1 million to enhance Meade Stadium, home to URI Rams football.
- The project includes the installation of synthetic turf and stadium lighting.
- Used throughout NCAA sports and the National Football League, synthetic turf provides a resilient surface, allowing for back-to-back events as well as use during or immediately after inclement weather. It will equip the facility to handle the demands of varsity, club, and intramural teams.
- The estimated project cost is \$4.1 million, and the anticipated timeline for installation is fall 2020. If all funds can be raised in time, there is a chance the project is completed by the start of the 2019 season.

BJORN TO REPRESENT CAA ON NCAA DIVISION I FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP COMMITTEE

- URI Director of Athletics **Thorr Bjorn** will represent CAA Football on the NCAA Division I Football Championship Committee.
- Bjorn will serve a four-year term on the committee, which consists of one representative from each conference that is eligible and applies for automatic qualification (AQ) and is granted an AQ to participate in the Division I Football Championship.
- For committees that administer championships in team sports, at least 50 percent of the positions on each sport's committee are filled by athletics administrators.
- Active coaches are not considered for this committee due to the timing of the majority of the committee's work.
- Members are appointed for one four-year term and may be reappointed for a second four-year term only after being off the committee for three consecutive years.

JIM FLEMING

Head Coach - Fifth Season

Jim Fleming was named the 20th head coach in Rhode Island football history in December of 2013. He enters his fifth season at the helm in 2018.

In 2017, Fleming saw six of his players earn all-conference honors. Harold Cooper earned CAA Football All-Conference Second Team honors as a running back and third-team recognition as a kick returner. Wide receiver Aaron Parker was named to the second team, while wide receiver Marvin Beauvais, defensive tackle Brandon Ginnett, offensive tackle Dino Boyd and punt returner Matt Pires were all on the third-team. The Rams also had their most victories in seven seasons.

For the second consecutive season, Fleming's team set a program mark for number of players to earn CAA Football Academic All-Conference recognition. The Rams had 22 players earn the honor in 2016, after having 18 receive the recognition in 2015. In 2016, Fleming had two players earn CAA Football All-Conference honors, as kick returner Harold Cooper was named to the second team and defensive end Jose Duncan took home third-team honors. Fleming also led the team to its first Governor's Cup victory since 2011 as the Rams defeated Brown 28-13 in the annual in-state battle.

In his second season the Rams earned eight spots on the CAA Football All-Conference Team, the most for Rhode Island since 1995. Sophomore Harold Cooper was a first-team

selection as a kick returner and a third-team pick at running back. He also was named to the 2015 Division I All-New England Football Team as a kick returner. Also earning CAA Football All-Conference honors were left tackle Tyler Catalina (second team), linebacker Adam Parker (second team), safety Tim Wiendaw (second team), defensive lineman Mike Ezirike (third team), tight end Charlie McKeeman (third team) and cornerback Myles Holmes (third team).

Though the Rams went 1-11 mark in Fleming's first season in Kingston, the team improved as the year moved along. Five players - linebacker Andrew Bose, fullback Justin Favreau, wide receiver Robbie Jackson, offensive tackle Tyler Catalina and kick returner Myles Holmes all earned a spot on the CAA Football All-Conference Team. Bose was the first Rhody linebacker to earn first-team honors in 16 seasons. He and freshman tight end Charlie McKeeman earned All-America honors from TonySoftli.com. Rhode Island also had 12 players earn a spot on the CAA Football Academic All-Conference Team.

Following the season, Bose signed as an undrafted free agent with the NFL's Baltimore Ravens, while running back Lyle McCombs signed with the Canadian Football League's Toronto Argonauts.

Fleming came to Rhode Island from Central Florida, where he was the defensive coordinator for the No. 15 Knights. In 2013, Fleming helped UCF earn a spot in the Tostitos Fiesta Bowl.

The 2013 season marked the second straight year that Fleming has helped guide UCF to a bowl game. In 2012, the Knights had the top-ranked scoring and pass defense in Conference USA and were ranked 29th nationally in scoring defense en route to a spot in the Beef O'Brady Bowl, where they defeated Ball State, 38-17.

Fleming has a track record of success, including as a head coach. In two seasons at Sacred Heart, he was a two-time Northeast Conference Coach of the Year while posting a 21-1 record. His team won the 2001 Mid Major I-AA National Championship to cap off a perfect 11-0 season. In his first year with the Pioneers, Fleming orchestrated the nation's best turnaround. Inheriting a team that had gone 2-9 the previous season, Fleming led Sacred Heart to a 10-1 mark in 2000, ending the season ranked No. 5 in the nation.

A veteran of 29 seasons of college football, Fleming has coached for teams in CAA Football, the AAC, the ACC, Conference USA, the MAC, the former Atlantic 10 (now CAA Football), the NEC, the Ivy League and the Big Sky Conference.

Fleming's defense in 2012 included safety Kemal Ishmael, the Conference USA Defensive Player of the Year who was a seventh-round draft pick for the Atlanta Falcons. Defensive end Troy Davis was placed on the All-C-USA First Team, cornerback A.J. Bouye grabbed a spot on the second team and lineman Deion Green was voted on to the all-freshman team. Bouye, Davis, Cam Henderson and Ray Shipman all signed rookie free-agent deals.

At Kent State in 2010, Fleming coached the linebackers for the Mid-American Conference's top-ranked defense. The Golden Flashes led the conference in sacks and tackles for loss, and Fleming's linebackers were a major reason. Middle linebacker Cobrani Mixon earned a spot on the All-MAC First Team by collecting 11.5 tackles for loss, 6.5 sacks, one interception, two forced fumbles and 82 overall tackles, while All-MAC Third Team selection Dorian Wood led the Golden Flashes with 96 tackles (11.5 for loss). Luke Batton delivered 68 tackles at the other outside linebacker position.

Fleming spent six seasons at Akron (2004-09) as the defensive coordinator and secondary coach. He helped the Zips win their first MAC Championship and qualify for the Motor City Bowl in 2005. Under Fleming, the defense produced four All-MAC honorees, including the league's second-leading tackler in freshman Brian Wagner and the program's second-ever three-time All-MAC selection in Almondo Sewell. Fleming's defenses at Akron consistently performed among the nation's best, ranking 32nd in total defense in 2005, and 31st in passing defense in 2009.

Prior to Akron, Fleming spent two years (2002-03) as the defensive backs coach at North Carolina. That stint came after his remarkable two-year run as the head coach of Sacred Heart. During their championship run, the Pioneers ranked second in the nation in scoring, pass efficiency and turnover margin, fourth in total defense and seventh in scoring defense and passing yards allowed. Fleming was named the Northeast Conference Coach of the Year in both 2000 and 2001.

A native of New York, N.Y., Fleming also spent two years as defensive coordinator/defensive backs coach at Villanova (1998-99) and four years (1994-97) coaching linebackers (1994) and defensive backs (1995-97) at East Carolina. His 1997 squad ranked second in Conference USA in pass defense, while in 1995, the Pirates finished 9-3 and earned a berth in the Liberty Bowl where they defeated Stanford, 19-13. That season, the ECU defense ranked seventh nationally in pass efficiency defense, producing 33 takeaways and 19 interceptions.

No stranger to the Ocean State, Fleming spent the 1993 campaign as the defensive coordinator at Brown where the Bears went from 0-10 and last place in the Ivy League, to 4-6 and a tie for fourth place in the conference. From 1987-92, he had a successful six-year stretch at Boise State, including the final three seasons as defensive coordinator. His 1991 Broncos' defense led the nation in rushing defense, was third in turnover margin and led the Big Sky Conference in every statistical category. In 1990, BSU finished 10-4 and advanced to the semifinals of the Division I-AA playoffs, leading the conference in scoring defense.

Fleming is a 1982 graduate of the University of the South with a degree in English. While there, he was a four-year starter in football and baseball, earning all-conference honors as a tight end in 1981. Fleming began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at South Carolina in 1985.

He and his wife, Leslie, have four children: Jimmy, Will, Kate and Meg. Will played tight end/fullback for Akron from 2009-12 and is now on the Rhode Island staff.
