CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- Last name is pronounced moo-STOCK-us.
- Was selected by the Royals in the first round of the 2007 first-year player draft (2nd pick overall behind Rays LHP David Price).
- Is a 3-time All-Star (American League for KC in 2015 & 2017, National League for Mil in 2019).
- In 2015 received votes for the American League Most Valuable Player Award.
- In 2017 was American League Comeback Player of the Year after breaking the Royals' single-season record for HR (38; Steve Balboni, 36 in 1985)...competed in the 2017 All-Star Game HR Derby.
- Received Rawlings Gold Glove Award votes for 3B in 2012, 2015, 2018 and 2019 and finished second in the balloting in 2012.
- Over the last 3 seasons is 1 of only 6 Major League players to produce at least 87 doubles, 101 HR and 267 RBI and the only player in that group with fewer than 300 strikeouts (Nolan Arenado, Cody Bellinger, Paul Goldschmidt, Manny Machado, J.D. Martinez).
- Has made 42 career Postseason apps...hit .304 during the Royals' 2015 World Series victory over the New York Mets and hit safely in all 5 games.
- With 2 outs in the bottom of the 10th inning of Game 1 of the 2018 National League Division Series, produced a walkoff single off Col's Adam Ottavino.
- Helped KC to the 2015 World Series with a homer off Tor's David Price in Game 6 of the American League Championship Series, a 4-3 Royals win.
- In the 11th inning of the 3-2 Royals win in Game 1 of the 2014 American League Division Series hit the go-ahead HR off Fernando Salas.
- In the 10th inning of the 8-6 Royals win in Game 1 of the 2014 American League Championship Series at Bal hit a 2-run HR off Brian Matusz.
- Missed most of the 2016 season, first with a fractured left thumb and then with a torn anterior cruciate ligament in his right knee suffered on 5/22 at WSox during a collision with teammate Alex Gordon.
- In 2015 made 140 starts, all at 3B, for the World Series champion Royals.
- On 9/12/15 at Bal produced 9 RBI, a career high and Royals single-game record...included a grand slam off T.J. McFarland.
- In 2011 made his Major League debut on 6/10 at LAA (1-3, 1r, 1bb)...singled off Ervin Santana for his first career hit...in his second appearance, on 6/11 at LAA, hit his first home run (solo off Joel Piñeiro).
- In 2010 was the Texas League Player of the Year, winner of the George Brett Award as KC's minor league player of the year and participated in the SiriusXM All-Star Futures Game at Angels Stadium.
- Was drafted in 2007 and entered the very next season rated the Royals' top prospect.

2019 SEASON

- Was an All-Star for the third time in his career and a National League All-Star for the first time.
- For the fourth time in his career received votes for the Rawlings Gold Glove award for third basemen.
- For the second consecutive season helped lead the Brewers to a Postseason appearance.
- Was the Brewers' Player of the Month for May (26g, .270, 8 HR, 21 RBI).
- Made 93 starts at 3B and 40 starts at 2B...also made 1 start at DH.
- Produced at least 28 HR for the third consecutive season and for the second time in 3 seasons had at least 35 HR.
- On 4/9 at LAA made the 1,000th appearance of his Major League career.
- On 7/16 vs Atl singled off Huascar Ynoa for his 1,000th career hit.
- Produced season-high hitting streaks of 12 (7/6-7/22) and 11 (6/5-6/17) games.
- In the 7-5 Brewers win on 9/11 at Mia celebrated his 31st birthday with 3 hits, 2 HR and 5 RBI, including the game-winning 2-run HR in the top of the ninth inning.

PERSONAL: Graduated from Chatsworth (CA) High School, which also produced Val Kilmer, Kevin Spacey, Kirk and Candace Cameron, Dwight Evans and Matt Cassel...at Chatsworth High was named National Player of the Year by several media outlets, including *Baseball America* and *Collegiate Baseball*...his uncle, Tom Robson, was a first baseman with the Rangers from 1974-75 and a coach for the Rangers, Mets, Reds and Chiba Lotte Marines of the Japanese Professional League...Robson was the Reds' hitting coach for part of the 2003 season...follow on Twitter @Moose_8.

- On 15-day disabled list with a fractured left thumb, May 7-20, 2016; included a rehabilitation assignment at Northwest Arkansas, May 18-20.
- On 15-day disabled list with a torn anterior cruciate ligament in his right knee, May 23-remainder of the season, 2016; was transferred to the 60-day disabled list, June 14.
- Was signed by the Royals to a 1-year contract through the 2018 season with an option for 2019, March 10, 2018.
- Was acquired by the Brewers for OF Brett Phillips and RHP Jorge López, July 28, 2018.
- Brewers did not exercise his 2019 contract option, October 30, 2018.
- Was re-signed by the Brewers to a 1-year contract through the 2019 season with a mutual option for 2020, February 28, 2019.
- Brewers did not exercise his 2020 contract option, November 1, 2019.
- Was signed by the Reds to a 4-year contract through the 2023 season, December 5, 2019.
