SMITHY
HELLES LAGER

Smithy is a golden lager with a soft malty flavor and a round dry finish. Poured with a creamy white head.

4.8% ABV 18 IBU



If you enjoyed our Original Lager, Smithy is your new go-to. Coming in at 4.8% and 18 IBUs, Smithy is your go-to golden craft lager, full of soft malty flavor with a round dry finish.



RIVET
WEST COAST STYLE IPA

Rivet is a dank, golden West Coast IPA. Full of intense hop aroma plus citrus, floral and pine scents. There's a slight malt sweetness to give it a backbone and to balance the bitterness.

6.3% ABV 72 IBU



Rivet will put a stronghold on your love of IPAs at 6.3% ABV and 72 IBUs. Intense hoppy flavor is joined together with citrus, floral and pine aromas to create a dank, golden West Coast IPA. Third Wave fans will find a new favorite in Rivet.



GROOVE
HAZY IPA

Groove is hoppy but not bitter. It's easy like Sunday morning. This yellow hazy IPA uses fruit-forward hop varieties that add a burst of tropical fruit notes with just enough bitterness.

6.0% ABV 45 IBU



Big Hazy lovers, welcome to your new hazy IPA. Groove is sure to make its mark with juicy, hoppy flavor and a super smooth finish at 6.0% ABV and 45 IBUs. This IPA contains fruit-forward hop varieties that add a burst of tropical fruit notes with just enough bitterness.



TWIST
PALE ALE

Twist is a European and American hybrid pale ale. This golden-orange ale has some hop bitterness plus earthy floral notes to balance it out.


5.2% ABV 40 IBU

We will have music and food on Friday and Saturday so it will be a great time to come and celebrate the first tapping of the beer as we re-open our space. Festivities are March 5th, 6th, and 7th.

Delivery and Shipping Updates

Over the past year, we have driven close to 13,000 miles delivering beer and it helped immensely to keep us in business. We are so grateful to everyone who has supported our business this way and so many other ways. However, the number and frequency have declined as COVID continues to change all of our lives and patterns of living and so we are moving to one day each week for delivery and shipping.

We still want to be able to offer these services to those who live too far or are still quarantining at home. We will be shipping and driving throughout Hamilton County for deliveries on Wednesdays only starting this week.

This Week's Events for Bockfest: **March 4-7, 2021**

It is the most wonderful time of the year in Cincinnati: Bockfest! While things will be different this year, the great tradition of goats and bock beers will continue in the Queen City for the 29th time. Remember that reservations are highly recommended (if not required) for all of these events.

Here are some of the highlights of Bockfest 2021: **All weekend at Fibonacci Brewing – New Baby Goat!** Fibonacci has a new baby goat named Buttercup and two bock beers named for two of their goats. Buttercup's namesake beer is a Dunkles Bock, and the other beer is a New Riff rye whiskey barrel-aged Doppelbock named Honey after another resident goat.
