Each beer that you want to enter into the event will require a \$150 registration fee – which will include a \$50 stipend for brewing supplies as well as entry for up to five team members to the kickoff party event on 3/13 at the Sam Adams Cincinnati taproom.

At the kickoff event, attendees will get the opportunity to meet with Sam Adam's Cincinnati's head brewer Chris Siegman and to tour the taproom's brewery facility.

Registration is open, and it will remain that way until 3/13 over here – so if you're wanting to take part, make sure you get your registration in as soon as possible. You can submit as many entries as you want, but each one will require its own registration. Your beer needs to be done and submitted by May 30th, and the winner of the contest will brew their recipe with Chris Siegman, and it'll hit the taps for the Boards & Brews main event that will happen on 8/7/22.

Grab a bock beer and some food and Rock out with The Klaberheads before heading out to our participating venues in Over-the-Rhine/Downtown and around Cincinnati with their own specials.

Shake off those cobwebs on Saturday morning and cheer on the Bockfest 5K runners at 10A. The Bock Beer Experience kicks off at 12P where you can sample over 30 bock beers! If you've been around for a little while, you know that I've pretty much split the year up into several different seasons based upon what lager beer I am drinking at the time. It starts in the summer, where I'm knocking back lighter lagers, Pilsner, Dortmunder, Helles... I love 'em. As we ease our way into the fall, I break out the Oktoberfest beers... and I go heavy on 'em too. Winter is time for Schwarzbier – dark lagers that are packed with flavor, but still crisp and drinkable. The spring, though? Spring is for Bock.

I recognize that you might not know what I'm talking about – Bock is strange to a lot of folks. You can <u>read a little</u> <u>more about the style here</u> – or venture down to <u>Cincinnati's Bockfest in March</u>. In my book, though, the only real way to understand Bock beer is to drink a ton of it with lots of different folks in lots of different situations. That's what you should be doing this spring.

Lucky for you, Cincinnati is home to a *ton* of Bock beer. More than it makes sense to exist. I love it, and you should too. Here's your chance to see what the style is all about. MadTree sets opening date for its OTR location

Cincinnati's second-largest craft brewery will open its new sun-soaked Over-the-Rhine location in time to enjoy the coming good weather. MadTree Brewing will debut the Alcove, an urban oasis in the former Color Building at 1400 Vine St. in Over-the-Rhine, on **March 8**.

Oakley-based MadTree — Cincinnati's second-largest brewery by number of barrels brewed — plans to bombard visitors with greenery and live plants in every corner of the Alcove. The large outdoor courtyard, a unique attraction in Over-the-Rhine's dense urban landscape, will take center stage with its large Chinese elm trees. The back covered portion of the patio is a four-season greenhouse with living chandeliers and herb boxes, which will be used to grow botanicals for use in a new cocktail program at the bar. The Alcove will serve kegged cocktails and stock bottles of spirits to mix drinks. The Alcove will have 16 to 20 beers on tap, but also cider and kegged wines.

The Alcove will house two private event spaces with their own bars, one in the back bar area as well as on the third floor, which used to house the space where legendary Cincinnati boxer Ezzard Charles trained. Charles was the subject of the first beer release in a MadTree series called Legendary Lager, which pays tributes to local legends and their stories.

Through MadTree's membership in the 1% for the Planet movement, where companies pledge 1% of their profits to causes that further environmental sustainability, the brewery is committing part of its proceeds to the revitalization of Laurel Park in the West End, including the planting of more than 100 new trees and a new statue of Ezzard Charles. That was made possible through a gift from the Carol Ann & Ralph V. Haile Jr. Foundation.

The Alcove is taking over space that used to house Wielert's Cafe, where it will have a main bar and dining room. It also contains portions of the former Kaze restaurant space. The space was designed by the Drawing Department, and Oswald Construction is serving as the general contractor. The buildings are owned by the Cincinnati Center City Development Corp. (3CDC).

MadTree is Cincinnati's second-largest craft brewery, brewing 25,000 barrels in 2020, the most recent numbers provided to the *Business Courier*.
