Maximum Totality

The total solar eclipse happening on Monday, April 8 offers Ohioans a rare opportunity to see one of the greatest shows in the cosmos. The path of totality travels from western Ohio to the Lake Erie shore, with several major cities - including Akron, Cleveland, Dayton and Toledo - in line for the full show as the moon completely blocks out the sun.

However, the further from the center of the path you get, the shorter the duration of totality. For example, while downtown Cleveland will see the total eclipse for an astonishing three minutes and 48 seconds, viewers in Massillon will only get 28 seconds of the celestial show. If you want to experience the total eclipse for as long as possible - with an Ohio craft beer in hand, of course - grab your eclipse glasses and take a trip to these breweries along the center of the path of totality to enjoy close to four minutes of astronomical bliss.

Auglaize and Mercer Counties

Western Ohio gets the totality of the eclipse first and for the longest duration on Monday, April 8. Gongoozlers Brewery in New Bremen holds the distinction as the Ohio brewery under totality for the longest duration: three minutes and 57.5 seconds. The brewery taproom and beer garden will be open 1-5 p.m., and the first 70 people to RSVP will receive a complimentary pair of eclipse glasses. More details at gongoozlersbrewery.com

Nearby Tailspin Brewing in Coldwater will be the first Ohio brewery to experience totality, starting at 3:08:52 p.m. and lasting for three minutes and 52 seconds. They'll celebrate starting at noon with live music, BBQ and a special beer brewed to mark this momentous occasion. Follow Tailspin on Facebook for more details to be announced.

Moeller Brew Barn will host a patio party for the eclipse at their brewery in Maria Stein, replete with three minutes and 57.2 seconds of totality. They'll release their Solar Eclipse light stout and will be pouring black and tans - er, make that dark and lights – with Solar Eclipse floated over Flew the Coop hazy IPA. Wyandot County

<u>Carey Brewing Station</u> is turning their three minutes and 54 seconds of eclipse totality into a weekend-long bash. The brewery will have their patio and outdoor bar in full swing, weather permitting, starting on Friday, April 5. Events are planned Friday through Monday, including live music, solar beer tastings and even the opportunity to camp on-site to avoid the potential hassle of <u>eclipse tourism</u> traffic. Logan County

One week ago, the community of Russell's Point was hit by a <u>devastating tornado</u> that took the lives of three people, injured many more and left a trail of destruction in its wake. <u>Indian Lake Brewing Company</u> was in the path of the tornado and sustained some minor damage but is re-opening today at 4 p.m. after spending the past week helping with cleanup and support efforts for the residents impacted by the storm.

As the recovery continues, the brewery is still gearing up for their planned eclipse celebration on Monday, April 8. Russells Point will get three minutes and 54 seconds of totality, and Indian Lake Brewing will commemorate the event with a special beer on tap and some eclipse-themed merch. Lorain County

The cities of Amherst, Avon and Lorain will all experience about three minutes and 53 seconds of totality on Monday, April 8 as the last municipalities along the center of the path before it continues on into Lake Erie.

- <u>Avon Brewing Company</u> will host a pop-up preview event at their soon-to-be <u>new home in the Lorain Shipyards</u>.
 Ticket holders will receive eclipse glasses, a drink ticket and access to an all-you-can-eat buffet. Details at <u>facebook.com/avonbrewingco</u>
- Meanwhile, a half mile away at <u>Bascule Brewery</u>, they'll be releasing Swamp Lily black IPA and giving away commemorative eclipse glasses (the kind you wear on your face) and glasses (the kind you drink from) with any beer purchase while supplies last. They'll be releasing a special beer for the occasion and will hand out eclipse viewing glasses to the first 100 customers through the door on Monday, April 8. 
However you're planning to witness the eclipse, please do it safely and responsibly, with respect for the local communities that will be hosting so many excited spectators taking in this rare celestial marvel.




The votes are counted, and the Winner will be announced in this Sunday's Cincinnati Enquirer.
