On Saturday-Sunday, June 29-30, Rhinegeist will be hosting "Stairway to Eleven," an epic party that would make even Dionysus jealous. The party's theme will be a blend of rock-androll and ancient mythology – Greek, Roman, Norse – "think partying with the gods in Omnipotent City in Thor: Love and Thunder," says Rhinegeist. Guests are encouraged to wear togas, and there will even be a make-your-own-toga station for \$10, which you'll want for the best-dressed contest on Saturday from 3-5 p.m.

"We're super stoked! Basically, we're throwing a giant rock-and-roll toga party to celebrate our 11th birthday!" Tracey Ireland, Rhinegeist's vice president of marketing, said in a press release. "We'll be rocking out to guitar-heavy anthems all day, wearing togas and mythical costumes, playing games, dancing and having some great beers. It's going to be EPIC!" The taproom will be decked out with Greek columns, living statues, Elysian decor, tapestries and a Fountain of Youth. The party Saturday will also feature a "Strength of the Gods" contest, with games to show off your strength and skills from 1-3 p.m., as well as a sultry, Hades-themed dance party (21+) on the rooftop with DJ Castle from 8 p.m. to midnight. The decor and activations will remain up through Sunday, and there will also be a special Toga Yoga event on the roof Sunday at 10 a.m. And, of course, it would not be a toga party without beer: Rhinegeist will have the "nectar of the gods" in the form of a slate of rare and exciting brews on tap throughout the weekend.

MadTree Brewing breaks ground on \$8.5M Blue Ash facility

Cincinnati's third-largest locally owned craft brewery is planning to open its third location in the first quarter of 2025. A groundbreaking ceremony for <u>MadTree Brewing's Parks & Rec facility in Blue Ash</u> was held Wednesday, June 26. <u>In</u> <u>December 2023</u>, the company landed key funding for the project, in which it will repurpose a 15,000-square-foot former airplane hangar at Summit Park. Over the next few months, the facility will be transformed into an indoor/outdoor restaurant within the city's Designated Outdoor Refreshment Area (DORA), meaning patrons can consume alcohol in open containers. "There are a lot of components to this," Rhiannon Hoeweler, vice president of experience and impact at MadTree, told me. The project will not open in phases. It's expected to cost around \$8.5 million. The buildout will create 150 temporary jobs. Core Resources is the general contractor, and MSA Design will handle the architectural work. Hoeweler said the company is still evaluating design firm options. "It will be a combination of our internal marketing and experience team and an outside party," she said. The annual construction payroll is expected to be around \$2.8 million.

The new location is set to be LEED Silver certified and will include a taproom, solarium, an outdoor beer garden and a recreational area. The space will also feature a giant tree sculpture, living walls and a campground area with a refurbished camper, games and an outdoor playscape for kids. "This location truly delivers on MadTree's mission of connecting people to nature and each other," co-founder Brady Duncan said in a news release.

The design of the new facility is meant to be sustainable and inclusive. For example, it will feature accessible seating, including a lowered bar for wheelchair access, a calming room, an adult changing table and many vegan and gluten-free menu options for those with dietary restrictions.

"It is really important to us to design this space as thoughtfully and inclusively as possible," Hoeweler said. "We continue to learn from our current locations, and we're building those learnings into Blue Ash to make Parks & Rec the best space possible." The new location will also include two large private event spaces, available to rent for weddings, business meetings, fundraisers and more. The company is already booking events in advance of next year's grand opening. MadTree plans on hiring an additional 100 people at the new location, bringing its total staff from 200 to 300. Hoeweler said the new facility will provide even more opportunities for the company to give back to the community. The plan is to triple revenue and have a \$5 million environmental impact on the area by 2030 through being a part of the 1% for the Planet initiative. It is a commitment to donate 1% of sales to local environmental nonprofits. According to Hoeweler, MadTree is on track to meet its goal. Since 2019, the company has racked up more than 6,700 volunteer hours and planted 15,000 trees. MadTree also recently surpassed the \$1 million mark for local environmental impact. The planning for this project has been in the works for quite some time. Duncan first teased the possibility for a new location about a year ago on the "Above the Fold," a podcast produced by the *Cincinnati Business Courier*. Blue Ash officials reached out to the company a few years ago with the opportunity. MadTree has a 15-year lease with the city, who currently owns the property. The brewery, founded in 2013, has a long history of revitalizing old spaces. Its Oakley location sits in the former RockTenn plant, and its Over-the-Rhine Alcove, which opened in 2022, is inside of the former Weilert's and Kaze spaces. In November 2023, the company earned its B Corp certification for social, environmental impact standards. This achievement puts the brewery in elite category. Only 0.2% of breweries in America hold the designation.
