The Works, Bad Tom Smith Brewing coming to new Union Township development

A mixed-use project with a brewery, a restaurant and more is planned for an increasingly walkable, densifying area of Union Township in Clermont County. The 17,000-square-foot project is intended for five parcels, totaling 4 acres, around 4531 Glen Este-Withamsville Road, near several multifamily developments completed, underway or in the planning stages. The Union Township Zoning Commission will consider a zoning change for the project at its July 24 meeting. Co-applicants on the zoning change request include the Union Township Community Interest Company, or CIC, as well as Sizemore Holdings LLC and Jordan Mefford. The Union Township CIC is the township's economic development arm. It acquired the five parcels in separate transactions from 2016 to 2020.

Mefford is a partner in Epic Eeats Restaurant Group, owned by Lance Sizemore. Among the restaurant group's properties is the Works in Loveland. Renderings for the Union Township project, from Lexington-based Dehart Architecture, show a 5,000-square foot location for the Works and a two-level, 16,130-square-foot Bad Tom Smith Brewing Co location. Sizemore did not return a comment request.

The project's other components include three 2,335-square-foot ground-floor retail spaces; an 8,010-square-foot, second-floor office space; a 2,138-square-foot, second-story office space; an outdoor amphitheater; and a 175-space surface parking lot.

Cory Wright, Union Township administrator, said the project, which is in a recently created tax-increment financing district, could cost \$8 million to \$10 million. Pedestrian connectivity and accessibility is emphasized in accord with the township's vision for the area in its comprehensive plan. The project's buildings will front Glen Este-Withamsville Road, with the parking hidden in the back, "fostering a streetscape appearance and creating a firm sense of place that will help synergize the land uses in the area," according to the zoning change application. "It's all pushed up to the street, so you get that town center feel," Wright said.

Sizemore Holdings has a tentative purchase-and-sale agreement in place with the CIC and is likely to act as master developer of the site, according to Wright. Right now, it's unclear how the site will be tenanted.


The CIC has been marketing the site for conceptual mixed-use entertainment and retail for a number of years, attempting to draw on momentum from two PLK Communities projects to the south – Echelon Luxury

Apartments and Gentry East Apartments. As with the current project, the CIC previously acquired and sold the land underlying those apartments. Additionally, more than 800 apartments are planned or under construction at the southeast corner of Glen Este-Withamsville and Judy Lane, including market-rate, workforce and senior-living units, largely from Columbus-based Vision Development and Nashville-based Elmington Capital.

The surrounding area, which Wright called the Aicholtz Road corridor, was excessively single-family residential 15 years ago, all of it butting right up against the Eastgate South retail – an Aldi, Sam's Club and Steak 'n Shake. The township then began acquiring properties one at a time with the goal of creating more density and more transitional uses to buffer the heavy retail.

"What's happening there is the start of a walkable, mixed-use area of the township," Wright said. "We're building on the success of the apartments there. You put (in) that 4-acre restaurant and brewery and outdoor entertainment area, with retail, and it's all starting to come together there, and it's going to be absolutely beautiful."

MadTree Beer Named 'No. 1 IPA Worldwide'

A Cincinnati brewery is getting some global attention after it took home the title of "No. 1 IPA on the planet" from the prestigious World Beer Competition.

The World Beer Competition is put on by the Tasting Alliance, the same organization behind the San Francisco World Spirits Competition. The competition began in late 2023 and winners were recently announced, with MadTree's seasonal spruce tip brew, Holly Days, beating out beers from all over the world to be named the best IPA.

"This isn't just a win for MadTree; it's a win for Cincinnati and the entire Midwest brewing scene," Kenny McNutt, MadTree co-founder, said in a press release. "This award is also a testament to the passion, creativity, and skill of our brewers." MadTree says much of its success is owed to a dynamic duo reshaping its future. It recently promoted Brittany Frey to head brewer, making her just one of a few female head brewers in Ohio. Frey is an honors graduate from Cincinnati State's brewing science program and MadTree says she's championing diversity in brewing through initiatives like International Women's Day celebrations and Pink Boots Society collaborations. She was also earlier this year recognized in "Modern Brewsters," a portrait series of female craft brewers in Ohio by Kaitlin Owens.

The other half of this duo, Ryan Blevins has been with MadTree since the beginning and is now the brewery's brewing operations director. MadTree says his expertise drives its production and innovation, and he's keeping it at the forefront of craft brewing.

You'll have to wait until October to try the award-winning Holly Days, but MadTree says its year-round IPA, Seeing Colors, is currently the fastest-growing IPA in Greater Cincinnati.
